



- 4,000 guests participated in programs at The Mountain.
- 164 Volunteers provided over 4,000 hours of service.
- 600 young people participated in Youth Programs.
- 300 Mountain Members and friends participated in Mountain-Designed programs.
- Senior High MountainCamp included more hands-on learning with program tracks in Art, Music and Outdoor Leadership. All three tracks included a social justice element.
- Elementary MountainCamp began offering a choice of either one or two week sessions. Also new in 2012 was an Explorers session for youth ages 12 to 14, designed for the 'veteran' camper seeking more campouts, trips and adventure.
- Rock climbing, a long time Mountain-Camp favorite activity, is back, led by Rock Dimensions, a professional rock climbing and rope course outfitter!
- Many great service projects took place with ASCENDERS, Counselors In Training (CIT's) and Service & Adventure groups. The ASCENDERS painted a mural on the craft barn. The CIT's re-painted a mural at the Macon County Humane Society and also helped with fish shocking at the local hatchery. Service & Adventure did trail maintenance and helped with waste water management at The Mountain. Senior High CON Youth also helped with waste water management.
- Two sections of Explorers spent 3-4 days in either Pisgah National Forest or Panthertown Valley, packing in all supplies, setting up a base camp, camping out with tarps and cooking over open fire and propane stoves. Service & Adventure did a similar 5-day outdoor experience, backpacking to a different site each day.

- Kerry Keys was hired as Youth Program Coordinator, and two Youth Program Interns, Duncan Edwards and Nate Reider assisted with Fall Youth CONS.
- On line registration and donation capabilities through Campwise were fully implemented for all retreats, CONS and Camps as well as 2012 Annual Campaign contributions.
- In August, the long time Mountain tradition of closing our summer Camp season with Intergenerational Family Camp was reinstituted with great success. The second annual MountainCamp Staff Reunion immediately followed, with many participants travelling from across the country to attend both.
- Gay Spirit Visions began work on a new 'cob construction' for our parking lot kiosk as well as giving a fresh start to our herb and flower garden at the base.
- Cabin 5, out of service due to deterioration, was finally demolished as a service project by 30 youth from Dallas UU, along



- with their Director of Religious Education and chaperones.
- Elon University Students spent a service week at The Mountain in October working on projects on site and off, including The Mountain's Many Hands Peace Garden fall harvest and winter preparation, watershed mapping for the Land Trust of the Little Tennessee, and a day of hard trail maintenance for the Friends of Panthertown Valley.
- The 2012 Annual Campaign was launched in July with the theme 'Remembering Why.' Mountain members and donors generously responded for the third year in a row. Increasing numbers of donors are now giving on-line and more are participating in our recurring gifts program. We welcomed many new Annual Members, and a generous \$2500. donation from Harry and Rene Donovan was given as a match for lapsed donors.



- Many congregations supported The Mountain by Sharing the Plate, and several church retreats donated the plate from their worship service while on The Mountain. The Mountain participated in the Atlanta UU Picnic where a generous offering was collected for The Mountain.
- Thanks to the generosity of our donors, scholarships were awarded to over 25% of our campers. We were able to help every family that requested assistance.
- An amazing experience for all MountainCampers this year was the \$15,000 scholarship awarded by an anonymous foundation that enabled 12 underserved youth to attend MountainCamp. The campers included Burmese refugees as well as residents of homeless shelters.
- We survived a crisis with one of our wells as many generous donors came forward to help with this unbudgeted expense. Our primary well has been upgraded as we replaced the pump, drop line, the chlorine

and soda ash systems and added a submersible transducer that gives us constant data in real time.

■ We significantly improved the performance of our existing wastewater treatment plant by replacing three valves, fixing leaks in the chlorine contact tank and eliminating vegetation from growing in the sand filter beds.




- We upgraded all PC's in our network to a new operating system and migrated from in-house servers to Google Apps. These measures have improved network performance and reliability and enhanced employee collaboration and information sharing. Wireless access to the Internet was improved significantly to meet guest expectations and attract new retreat business.
- The Search Committee for a new Interim Director diligently worked qualifying and interviewing candidates. Ted Wisniewski was hired to succeed Lee Reading upon his retirement in March. 2013.
- Two weddings of long time members of The Mountain community took place at The Mountain. Former camper, counselor, and staff member Emily Green was married to Rob Katz in June. Danielle Rhodes, daughter of a former staff member and granddaughter of life Members Roger & Jean Johnson, was married to Robert Hart in July.
- The family of Anne Staley honored her final wishes by scattering her ashes here at The Mountain last November. Rev. Roy Reynolds and Jean Lamer performed a brief Memorial Service honoring Anne and her life as a dedicated member of Northwest Atlanta UU Congregation, a Life Member and Vision Holder of The Mountain, a tireless Mountain volunteer, and founder of our Mountain Endowment.
- The First Annual Southeast Unitarian Universalist Fall Institute at The Mountain



(SUUFI) was launched in October and was a great success. Dates are scheduled for October 2013 and 2014

- Mountain Thanksgiving was an intergenerational delight, with many new families joining in, and as usual, the gingerbread house making project was highly popular with all generations.
- The Mountain participated in the Giving Tree Exhibit at The Bascom Visual Arts Center in Highlands, and won the Nog-off competition with the most votes for the best tasting egg nog. Thanks to Brian Buckley, Kitchen Director, for sharing his secret family recipe.
- Addressing the realities of both season and finance, The Mountain 'dimmed the lights' and went on Winter Furlough December 7-Jan 22.

I am pleased to report the improvements to the operations and infrastructure of The Mountain under Interim Director, Lee Reading, and our dedicated staff. We had a successful year that included our traditional Mountain programs for Homecoming and Thanksgiving, a wonderful season for MountainCamp and Youth Cons, Intergenerational Family Camp, and many organizations and guests who found The Mountain to be an ideal site for their meetings and retreats. Critical repairs and upgrades to the wastewater treatment plant and the primary well have been completed. The sleeping rooms at The Lodge have been redecorated. Technology advancements included installation of the Campwise system for online registration and donations, improved networking, and upgrades to the operating systems.

We greatly appreciate Lee Reading's positive impact on The Mountain during his brief tenure as Interim Director. He has provided a positive transparent environment that has become the platform for the implementation of all improvements during the past 24 months. Lee fostered camaraderie among the staff and brought a culture of reality-based operations to The Mountain. His honest approach resulted in identification of issues in infrastructure that were addressed proactively. Lee's impact can also be seen in the work of staff and volunteers, activities in Mountain-designed programs and MountainCamp, and reconnections with Mountain members, SUUSI, and UU congregations. Thank you, Lee!

A search for the next Interim Director began in June with the formation of a committee of Trustees—Eunice Benton, Beverly Cree, Colin Kirkman, Charles Lee, and Marty Beech; and members—Bruce Kirkman and Roy Reynolds. The committee reviewed a large number of applicants and the Board approved the appointment of Ted Wisniewski as the next Interim Director to begin in February 2013.

Ted brings over 20 years of leadership experience managing residential youth camps in New York, Rhode Island, and North Carolina. He has been responsible for all aspects of planning, operations, human resources, and fund-raising. Ted employs a data-driven and systematic ap-

proach to problem solving, conservative spending practices, and encourages creativity and resourcefulness among employees. Welcome, Ted!

The Mountain Board of Trustees continues to serve the members through deliberate and thoughtful planning and actions. Led by the Institutional Advancement team, Trustees worked with Christy Kelly, Marketing and Development, to solicit donations from members and supporters through letters, phone calls, and personal visits, resulting in over \$235,000 in donations. The Institutional Performance Team used the results of small group meetings and the Mountain survey to revise the Vision, Mission, and Values statements for The Mountain. The Planning and Finance Team worked with Lee Reading, Interim Director, and Julie Brooks, Finances, on issues related to sales tax, operations calendar, and the audit. The Board Leadership Team worked on the Annual Report, finalized the nominations for new Trustees, and assisted with meetings. All Board Policies have been updated this year to reflect our current operations. Trudy Devle, Board Chair, stepped down in May after providing five years of outstanding leadership. Thanks, Trustees, especially Trudy!

And finally, we had the support of members, supporters, and guests who came to The Mountain and encouraged others to come for programs and personal retreats. We can see the differences made with their efforts during Volunteer Weekend. More people made financial contributions than last year. They promoted awareness of The Mountain and its programs in local congregations and communities. Together, we are working to assure that The Mountain will continue to enrich many lives. Thanks to all members, supporters, and guests of The Mountain!



Report of the Financial Advisor of the Board

STATEMENTS OF FINANCIAL POSITION

In 2012, The Mountain's financial position continued to improve with an overall increase to net assets of \$185,026, primarily due to forgiveness of debt in the amount of \$167,088. Our current assets declined by \$36,590, evidenced primarily by a reduction of cash on hand, and we continue to find ways to operate more efficiently while maintaining the standard of care that our guests deserve and expect.

It should be noted that our balance sheet continues to improve by reducing the significant burdens of prior debts that are being paid off and/or forgiven. Of the notes remaining on our books, \$347,253 consists of unsecured notes due to Mountain members. These notes are classified as current liabilities. We also hold a mortgage on the Turtle Pond property in the amount of \$162,163 which will be paid off once the property is sold.

STATEMENTS OF ACTIVITIES AND CHANGES IN NET ASSETS

Revenue in 2012 increased by \$193,214 as compared to 2011. This increase was primarily due to the aforementioned for-giveness of three demand notes totaling \$167,088. Our unrestricted donations remained stable, but the best news is that our program revenue increased by over \$49,000. Our staff should be commended for their diligent efforts to provide exemplary programming and guest services while operating on a very tight budget.

The staff has continued its efforts to reduce expenses through significant sacrifices that resulted in an overall decrease in expenses from 2011 to 2012 of \$78,606. Program expenses increased by \$15,393 from \$516,798 in 2011 and support services were reduced \$93,999 from \$486,866 in 2011.

It is significant to note that when looking exclusively at operations, which includes program revenue and expense as well as administration expenses, 2012 expenses exceeded revenue by \$173,127. In 2012,

that net expense was more than covered by contributions of \$235.332. This is a vast improvement over the results of many years in recent history where expenses consistently exceeded revenues and contributions by several hundred thousand dollars each year. As The Mountain's Balance Sheet continues to improve through the elimination of prior year debts, the financial outlook continues to look better and brighter. However, now that we have fundamentally stabilized our operations, we do feel that there is very little additional expense that can be cut. It is, therefore, up to each and every one of us who support The Mountain to Move Forward by participating in events, encouraging new visitors to come, and contributing in every way to our bottom line.

All monies, except for a small amount of operating funds in a checking account are invested in the Unitarian Universalist Common Endowment Fund of the Unitarian Universalist Association. As of April 30, 2013, The Mountain Endowment Fund's value was \$35.929.

In 2012 the Endowment Board determined that as a "Supporting Organization" of the MRLC it was charged with making contributions to the MRLC and voted to utilize the 6% distribution option, and to do so quarterly. In 2012 that amount totaled \$2,000.
